## Internships with the Pima County Superior Court IN SUMMER 2016

Students are invited to supplement their academic curriculum by interning in the Pima County Superior Court's **Pretrial Services Release Assessment Division** located at the Pima County Adult Detention Center OR in the **Pretrial Release Services Division** located at 150 W. Congress.

The general focus of the internship is to provide students with the opportunity to work in a structured criminal justice setting and develop professional-caliber skills related to conducting interviews, assessing information and writing reports. Interns interview defendants, conduct background investigations and assist in preparation of reports for the Court.

Intern candidates:

- Must be at least 20 years of age and work the designated hours of the intern position on a part-time basis.
- Must commit to intern a minimum of 135 hours per semester.
- Must have no Felony Convictions.
- Must agree to submit to fingerprinting and criminal history check.
- Must agree to sign a "No Hostage" waiver for the Sheriff's Department.
