Graduate Certificate in Terrorism Analysis

Are you looking to study terrorism? Are you hoping to work
in the intelligence community? Are you considering graduate
school?

START's (Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism)
Graduate Certificate in Terrorism Analysis aims to train the
next generation of scholars and analysts to examine
questions related to the behavior of terrorists and terrorist
groups, and how societies can best prepare and respond to
terrorist threats and attacks. Students also develop the
methodological skills necessary to pursue advanced
research on and analysis of terrorism. This four-course,
twelve-credit, fully online program can be completed in as
little as nine-months - or a more expanded two years. To

Grade Replacement Opportunity (GRO)

To use or not to use?

The Grade Replacement Opportunity at the UA is a tool that can be used by students under certain circumstances with good success. For students in professional programs, receiving a grade of D in a professional course is usually not considered "passing". In this case, GRO can certainly be used when retaking the course. Read the rules in the catalog: <https://www.registrar.arizona.edu/gro> and talk with your advisor to see if you are eligible for this option. In other degree programs, a grade of D may still be considered "passing". So then, using GRO becomes a matter of choice. Read the GRO policy and talk with your advisor about the pros/cons in this kind of situation. If you are retaking a course this Spring, **the deadline to file for GRO is Feb. 10th.** Filing for GRO is done online, through your Student Center.

is available January 1st of each year. If you are transferring in the middle of the academic year, and already have a FAFSA on file, you must add the UA school code. To do so, go to the FAFSA web site, click make corrections to a processed FAFSA and add our school code (001083). If you have financial aid at another institution, be sure to cancel it. Per federal regulations, aid can only be received at one college/university at any given time.

Most scholarships and grants available at the University of Arizona require the FAFSA to be completed by March 1! Since funding is limited, we recommend you apply by February 14th to meet the March 1st priority date. \$125.00 Unpaid Tuition Charge applied.
Begin \$250.00 Late Registration Fee for additional class units. Requires written statement, pre-payment, instructor and Dean's approval on a Change of Schedule form, and Registrar approval upon submission.

FEBRUARY 10

Last day to change from pass/fail to regular grade or vice versa with only instructor approval on a Change of Schedule form.
Last day to file for Grade Replacement Opportunity (GRO), deadline is 11:59 PM.

FEBRUARY 11

Change of Schedule form with Instructor and Dean's permission is required to change from pass/fail to regular grade or vice versa.

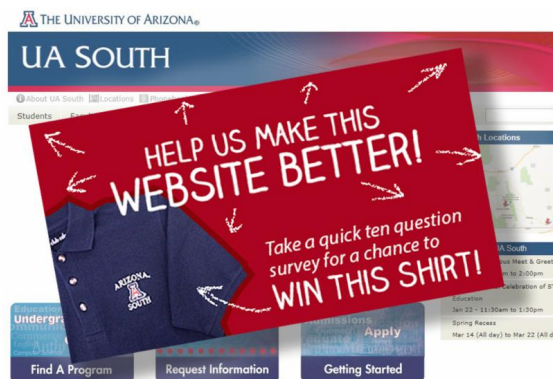
