The Negotiation Workshop II is an interactive experiential class on advanced negotiation skills. We will review Workshop I skills and further develop negotiation styles, enhance creativity and problem solving within the negotiating context, use persuasive techniques to maximize outcomes, examine coalitions and partnerships, and improve our ability to negotiate via information technology. We will continue to explore communication, both verbal and nonverbal, and the influence of culture throughout all of the sessions. The workshop is designed to reinforce the knowledge, skills and abilities from Workshop I and expand our negotiating toolkit.
